

Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP)

- By 2014, NCLB requires **all** students to be "proficient."
- The State has established a series of targets over the next nine years leading to 100% proficiency.
- Maine uses the Maine Educational Assessment (MEA) as the measure; a student must "meet" or "exceed" the standard to be "proficient."
- By year's end, all core subject teachers are expected to be "highly qualified."

Grade 4 State proficiency Targets for 2005-06:

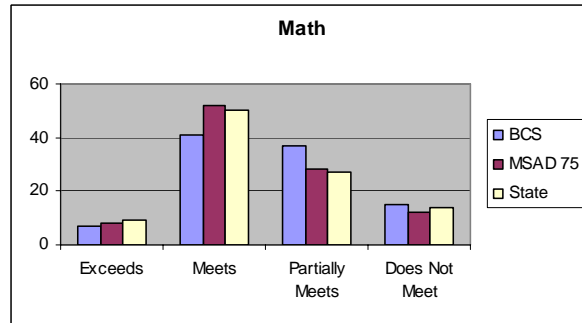
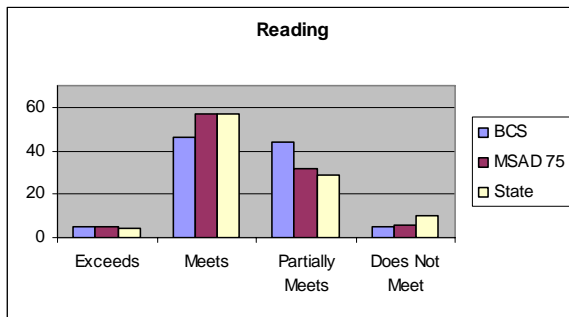

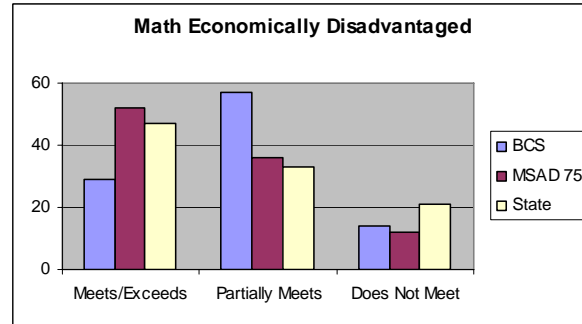

Grade 4 Bowdoin Student Achievement by Proficiency Level:



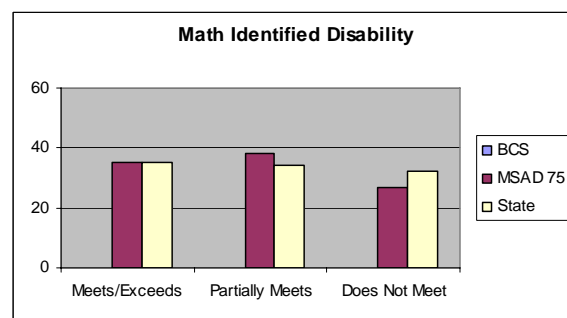
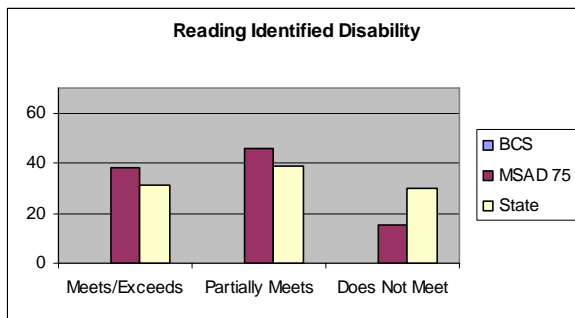
14 students are identified as economically disadvantaged.
