

**Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP)**

- By 2014, NCLB requires *all* students to be "proficient."
- The State has established a series of targets over the next nine years leading to 100% proficiency.
- Maine uses the Maine Educational Assessment (MEA) as the measure; a student must "meet" or "exceed" the standard to be "proficient."
- By year's end, all core subject teachers are expected to be "highly qualified."

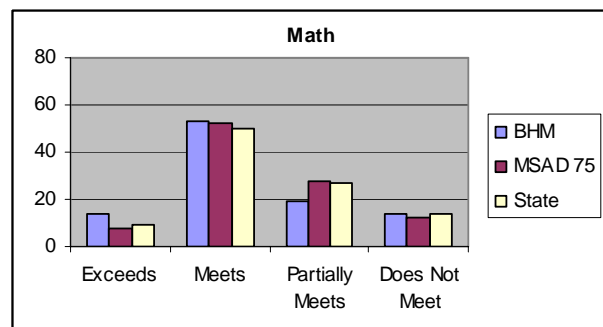
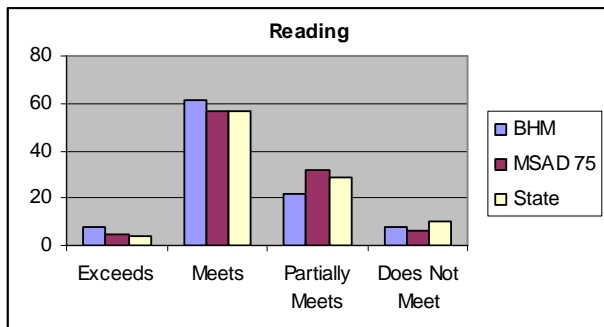
Grade 4 State proficiency Targets for 2005-06

44% of students meet or exceed the standard

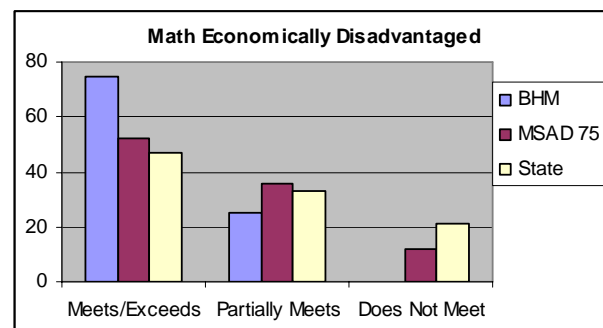
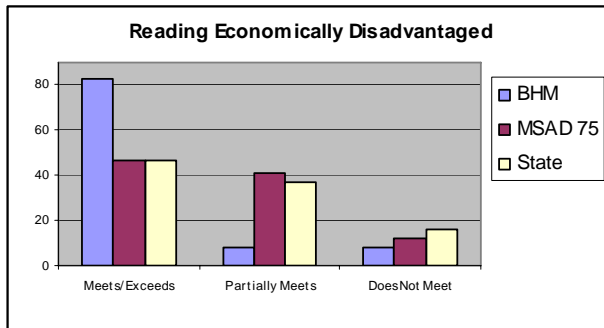
**Did Bowdoinham Community School make AYP for 2005-06?** **Yes**

**Grade 4 Bowdoinham Student Achievement by Proficiency Level:**



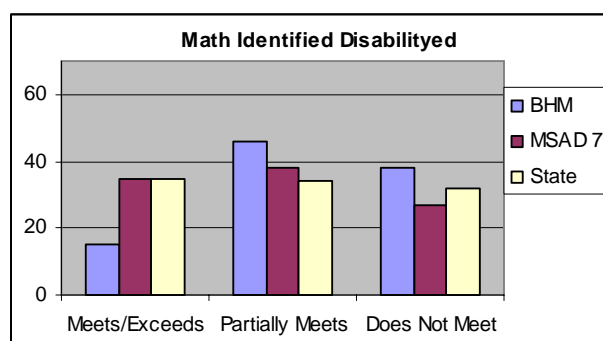
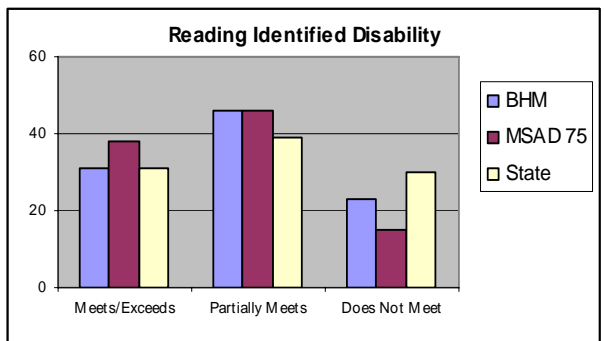
12 students are identified as economically disadvantaged. Ten met or exceeded the standard for reading.
